Notes on the Index

This is a cumulative index of the *Revolutionary Worker*, Volume 2 (Nos. 53-102, May 1, 1980—April 24, 1981). Articles within each category or subcategory are listed chronologically and referenced as to issue and page number (e.g., 57:4 refers to RW No. 57, page 4). Articles for which corrections subsequently appeared have the issue and page number of the correction in parentheses following the issue and page number of the article.

RW No. 53 was issued in three sections to accommodate the coverage of rapidly developing events around May 1st, 1980. They have been indexed as follows: 53A (a four-page section dated May 1 and designated "Red Flag Edition"); 53B (a twenty-page section dated May 5); and 53C (a thirty-two-page section dated May 1, covering national and international events for the week prior to May 1st).
